GOOD NEWS IN A BAD NEWS WORLD: THE DISCIPLESHIP OF YOUTH MINISTRY



The verse that our youth ministry uses as our theme is 1st Timothy 4:12

“Don’t let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith and in purity.”

I think this verse is a great foundation for a youth ministry because of three things:

1. This verse acknowledges that the youth are not merely the “future of the church”. The youth have a valid and important ministry here and now to all believers young and old.
2. This verse gives specific behaviors and attitudes that serve as an example to the believers.
3. This verse encourages the young people to be proactive in defining how others see them.

“Do not let anyone look down on you...”

How can young people control how they are seen? By setting an example. That’s the focus of our youth ministry. We don’t want to create a place where students are merely occupied or entertained. Our goal is to challenge our students to show others what discipleship looks like. Our goal is to teach them the truth about God so that their lives can be an example.

Some of the ways we are experiencing this are through students bringing their friends and even their families to church. It is so exciting to see the parents of our 4:12 kids coming to our church for the first time and even going so far as to becoming members themselves. We have also seen our students reach out into the world as missionaries both regionally and internationally. In fact, one of our students is bringing her grandfather with us on our next mission trip to Haiti.

If you have ever been to our 11am worship service, you have also seen that the front two or three pews are filled with students. This is a great testimony to the fact that our youth ministry here at Marion Methodist is not separate from the church as a whole but indeed an integral part of who we are as a body.

The next time you see one of our students I pray that they will be setting an example for you, and that you can encourage them as well!

FLY Intern - Steven Tallman


Hey everybody,

What's Next?

Is Anything Happening?

We have been hearing and reading a lot of information about our proposed new church, but it doesn't quite seem real because the site is still a vacant lot. There's no construction in progress, so it seems that not much is happening. However, nothing could be further from the truth. There is a lot of planning and design being done. These plans will need to be reviewed and approved by various governmental agencies to make sure our future building and property comply with building codes and safety standards.



One of the first plans to be developed for approval is the Preliminary Site Development Plan. This plan shows the proposed footprint of the building we will be constructing, where the building will be placed on the property, the location of proposed drainage and water retention or detention basins, how the property will be accessed from the surrounding streets, access for the fire department to get to the building, and the size and location of proposed parking areas. This plan also shows areas where potential future expansion of the building may occur over the next several years, and changes to the site which may occur, such as, additional parking, recreational fields, trails, etc. Basically this is a plan of how our building impacts the site, how the church intends to use the property and the surrounding infrastructure, and whether that plan is compatible with future development in the area. In addition to the Preliminary Site Development Plan, a Final Site Development Plan is also created, which shows only what we are planning to build during the initial phase of our project. It does not show the potential development that may occur in the future.

Our architect, Solum Lang, and our engineering firm, Hall & Hall Engineering, have prepared a Preliminary Site Development Plan, a Final Site Development Plan, and a Preliminary Plat. These plans will be presented to the Marion Planning and Zoning Board on June 14th. The Planning and Zoning Board will decide one of the following: to approve the plans, approve the plans with conditions, or reject the plans. Once the Planning and Zoning Board approves, these plans are scheduled to be presented at the City Council meeting on July 7th for the Council's approval.

Getting the Planning and Zoning approval and the City Council's approval on the Site Development Plans and the Preliminary Plat are important steps in the process of preparing for construction, but there is still more to do. After the site development plans and the preliminary plat comes the final site construction and grading plans, design of 35th Avenue, and submission of a traffic impact study to the City of Marion and to the Department of Transportation. The purpose of this traffic study is to determine if a turning/deceleration lane will be required on Highway 13. Once all of these are approved, we are ready to start construction. We are optimistic that all approvals will be received, and site grading can begin this fall.

Thank You



- When a hospital chaplain visits you, re-iterate that you are a member of this church and would appreciate a visit from your pastors or ask to speak to one of the hospital chaplains and explain to them that you would like to have your church notified.
