The Internal Memo

INTERNAL MEMO NOT MEANT FOR THE PUBLIC screamed the header of the sheet we all were handed. The memo fleshed out the process the college administration had walked through to make a decision to raise tuition, a decision that ultimately would affect all of our students and their parents.

The last paragraph began with an italicized sentence: When you are called upon to communicate with our publics please embody the high value of a small college education. The implication was clear; the comprehensive information given you was to be applied in the community in which we lived.

Paul's letter to the Christian Church at Philippi has a similar, yet more profound, dualistic purpose. The book we know as Philippians is an internal memo directed at building up and strengthening the church. As we read the words the directive is clear; the Christian is to embody the message in their life and living in such a compelling way that the faith becomes most attractive to the non-Christian.

During these next few months, Pastor Keith, Vicki and I will be employing this space in the Marion Methodist as an internal memo to prepare you for the application of your faith and witness in this generation. We start with the simple likelihood that non-Christian folks are much more likely to encounter one of us long before they open God's Word, thus it is best to be trained

for that occasion so that we might give them a wonderful impression of our dear Lord Jesus.

The heart of Christian worship is the reading and studying of the Scriptures. In them we pursue knowledge of and relationship with Christ. St. Jerome wrote: "To be ignorant of Scripture is to not know Christ." Thus, we spend many moments in worship teaching the scriptures and admonishing you to read, study and contemplate on them more fully.

The phrase *Sola Scriptura* ("by scripture alone") heralded in the Protestant Reformation means the Bible contains all knowledge necessary for salvation and holiness. *Sola scriptura* demands that all other authorities are subordinate to, and are to be corrected by, the written word of God. Your pastors and other church leaders believe this to be true.

Therefore, it is important for us to know the word of God, to engage in it and be bathing our minds and spirits in it daily. It is the "internal memo" that prepares us to witness with our lives to our God.

Here's the thing: most people don't read memos very thoroughly or carefully. Referring to the memo I referred to above, while many of us were well informed and robustly trained those years ago regarding how to positively address the value of a small college education when speaking to a prospective student's

parents, the memo got by many. One day the head of one of our departments was standing in my building with a family on their first campus visit and terrified by the cost of college was heard to say – "don't worry, I think the cost next year will be the same as next year."

I marveled at this man's ability to not apply what we had been prepared to apply, and I had to ask.

"Joe, why did you say we aren't raising tuition?"

"Well we aren't are we?"

I presented him the very same memo he had handled, hand been taught in and failed to embody. He looked at it, read it, then looked at me and said "I guess it got by me."

Millions of people have said the very same thing about God's Holy Scripture – "I guess it got by me." Now, I know in these days of a hundred emails, text messages, tweets, memos and Facebook posts each and every day, we easily can pass over a memo and not engage in it or even think it applies to us.

Obviously not every communication we receive has importance but – and let me be clear – two millennium of Christ followers have proclaimed the scriptures importance – take notice, take time, embrace it and be prepared to apply it – don't let it get by you.

Health Kits Needed!

Between the dates of 1/1/12 and 10/11/12, the UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) Sager Brown depot in Baldwin, LA. (where our kits are sent from the Thanksgiving Ingathering) distributed 120,768 health kits to persons in need in countries around the world. In addition, 32,820 were distributed within the U.S.

Health kits provide basic necessities to people who have been forced to leave their homes because of human conflict or natural disaster. They help victims reclaim their dignity and self respect and help in improving overall health.

During February, FUMC again will be a part of meeting this great need for so many people.

The contents of the health kits include:

- 1 new hand towel, lt.-med weight, no kitchen (15"x25" up to 17"x 27")
- 1 new washcloth
- 6 Band-aids (3/4")
- 1 bath sized bar of soap in wrapper (3 oz. or larger)
- 1 large, sturdy comb (no pocket-sized)
- 1 new toothbrush in original sealed wrapper (no child-sized)
- 1 fingernail clipper or metal nail file (no emery boards or toenail clippers)
- \$1.00 for toothpaste to be purchased by the UMCOR Depot

Individual items or monetary donations to purchase kit items are also welcome. Fold the towel and washcloth and lay other items on top. Place in Ziploc bag. They may be put in the designated box at church or taken to the church office.

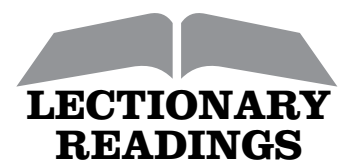
