## Broken skateboards and Church growth

Kids on skateboards descended upon the church, which was adjacent to downtown, the minute the school day ended and stayed until it was quite late. The police would not allow them to skate downtown, the schools didn't want the liability and there were a lot of them. At first, their presence at the church was overwhelming. They were rail riding, and thus, tearing all the paint off the hand rails, scratching up the sidewalks, falling everywhere and were kind of loud. The trustees needed to do something, but what?

One Monday night after a trustee meeting, there were about 20 kids skating around the church. As the trustees locked the building, 15 year old Travis, (one of the ringleaders) came flying off the steps onto the sidewalk demolishing his skateboard, and inflicting himself with major case of road rash. While not seriously hurt, he needed to get cleaned up, so a couple of Trustees went inside with him.

While they were washing him up and putting a couple of BIG Band-Aids on him two farmers, a nurse and Travis struck up a conversation. Here is their account of the conversation without the skateboard vernacular.

"Did you see me blow up?" Travis asked.

"Yeah it was a scary."

"Scary, it was awesome!!!! Anytime you do a trick that busts a skateboard, it's a beautiful thing!"

"You could have been hurt bad."

"Skateboarders are fast healers. We have to be."

Long pause while no one knew what to say -----

Travis continued; "Hey thanks."

"No problem."

"No, thanks for letting us skate here. Your church is the only place in town that lets us skate. Everyone else tells us to get the \*&%# out of here. You guys let us get drinks, use the bathrooms and hang out. You %^\*& guys are great, all of us love this church."

None of them had ever attended a service or church function.

The Trustees reconvened immediately after Travis left to join his buddies. Darle started saying: "I think Jesus would have been hanging out with these kids." Roberta said: "I think there's a lot we can learn from them." Steve said, "We have some liabilities and legalities ....and, we need to work them out so they have someplace to be." I remember telling Theresa that night, I think our church just became the body of Christ to a bunch of kids.

Over the next few years it was interesting how while most just wanted to skate, some became Christians, got roped into youth group and provided the best security force a downtown church ever could have. It was interesting how once we started seeing those different from ourselves as similar, once we started seeing past the tattoos, backward baseball caps, bad haircuts, piercings and very distinct wardrobes to their creation in Christ, a life giving relationship was born.

I see this as very important at First United Methodist Church in Marion.

In the last two decades our community has changed dramatically, there are many more of us and many differences between us externally. To truly be the authentic church, the church Jesus wants any part of, means we need to see everyone as a child of God and welcome in and around the Lord's house. Intentional conversation is necessary regarding how to reach groups of people that have not been reached by us before. Intentional listening is necessary to hear what is going on beyond the church walls, to hear what the needs of our community are and how we can spiritually and physically respond to this.

You and I know there are a lot of people on "skateboards" out there that don't feel like they are welcome anywhere. There is beauty in their soul, wisdom in their mind and love in their hearts that we will only know when we are truly authentic in our Christianity by talking to them, taking time with them and inviting them to our spiritual home, all because we know that Jesus would be hanging out with them, and if we have anything to do with him, we will want to hang out with them too.

This is part of what the Healthy Church Initiative is designed to assist us with and it is why I am unapologetically encouraging our full participation in it. Please be fully engaged and aware of what is coming to First United Methodist Church Marion in mid February – it may be a life changer for us all.

## Health Kits Needed!

Between the dates of 1/1/12 and 10/11/12, the UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) Sager Brown depot in Baldwin, LA. (where our kits are sent from the Thanksgiving Ingathering) distributed 120,768 health kits to persons in need in countries around the world. In addition, 32,820 were distributed within the U.S.

Health kits provide basic necessities to people who have been forced to leave their homes because of human conflict or natural disaster. They help victims reclaim their dignity and self respect and help in improving overall health.

During February, FUMC again will be a part of meeting this great need for so many people.

The contents of the health kits include:

- 1 new hand towel, lt.-med weight, no kitchen (15"x25" up to 17"x 27")
- 1 new washcloth
- 6 Band-aids (3/4")
- 1 bath sized bar of soap in wrapper (3 oz. or larger)
- 1 large, sturdy comb (no pocket-sized)
- 1 new toothbrush in original sealed wrapper (no child-sized)
- 1 fingernail clipper or metal nail file (no emery boards or toenail clippers)
- \$1.00 for toothpaste to be purchased by the UMCOR Depot

Individual items or monetary donations to purchase kit items are also welcome. Fold the towel and washcloth and lay other items on top. Place in Ziploc bag. They may be put in the designated box at church or taken to the church office.

## January 2013

This month, as I prepared the various financial reports for 2012, I took a moment to celebrate the many missions and ministries that your generous giving was able to financially support.

- > Though we did not raise our entire budget, we did end the year \$33,000 income over expenses.
- > Marion First continued our connectional responsibility with the United Methodist Church by paying 100% of our Apportionments.
- > The "Believe" Campaign raised the \$1.4 million that was pledged 3 years ago.
- > The Foundation raised over \$40,000, and with the leadership of that board, the portfolio is nearing \$500,000. The Foundation was able to disburse \$17,000 to the ministries of Marion First.
- > Over 100 of our children and youth were able to experience "church camp."
- > A dozen youth attended mission trips.
- > We gave 221 health kits, 28 sewing kits, 636 school kits, 9 layette kits, 10 birth kits, 51 baby jackets, & 1430 empty school bags to UMCOR for the Thanksgiving Ingathering.
- > We fed those that were hungry through the FLY program, Marion Pantry, and at Mission of Hope.
- > People were able to worship and experience Christ.
- > The Friendship Fund was able to assist over 90 individuals or households with assistance.

These are just some of the many ways that your generous gifts were used in 2012.

In Henry Nouwen's book "Spirituality of Fundraising," he states that "When we truly enjoy God's unlimited generosity, we will be grateful for what our brothers and sisters receive." We have many reasons to be grateful for God's generosity that has been bestowed to these and many other missions and ministries.

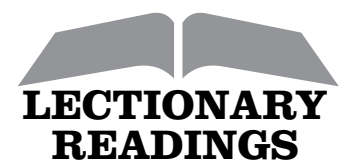
## Preparation of your 2012 tax return
