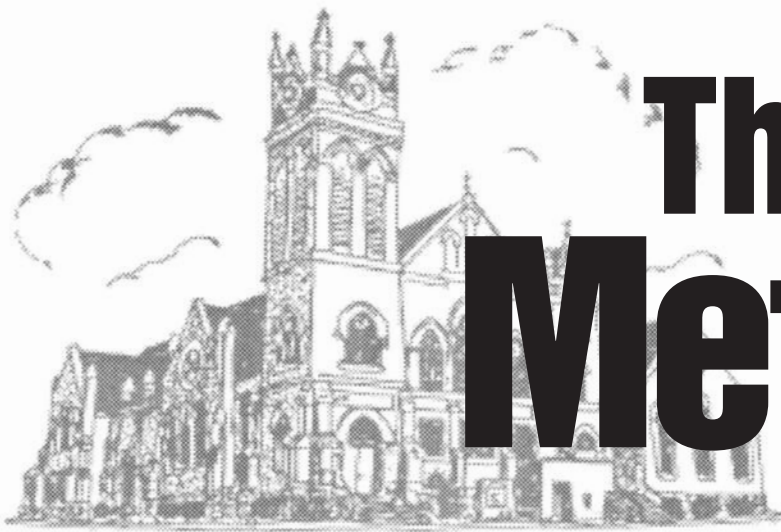

The Internal Memo - Part 3 Prayer

Prayer is both the easiest and the hardest thing we've ever done, and it is the epicenter of our relationship with God and our fellow Christians. We are a praying church!

We all feel like beginners when it comes to praying – none of us truly understands how it works, how God can listen and encounter each of us individually through prayer. Our earliest recollections of prayer are undoubtedly a simple table grace; "God is great, God is good..." or part of a bedtime routine, "Now I lay me down to sleep...". As we grow in years and our faith matures, our prayers become more personalized, but oftentimes they also become more challenging because we think we have to have just the right words; that God will pay more attention if we're eloquent or masterful in the way we pray. But when it comes right down to it, we need not worry about "proper" praying, "just talk to God. Share your hurts, share your sorrows, share your joys-freely and openly. God listens in compassion and love, just like we do when our children come to us. He delights in our presence. When we do this, we will discover something of inestimable value. We will discover that by praying we learn to pray". (Richard Foster, *Prayer*, p. 12-13, emphasis mine.)

Prayer is the main conduit of communication between us and

God and is the foundation of our relationship with him. God wants to hear what's on our hearts and minds, and is there to help us sort out our fears, frustrations, anxieties and concerns. He is also there to rejoice and celebrate with us when good things happen and to weep with us when we are engulfed by sorrow. Prayer is also the glue that holds the church together as we pray for each other and lift up each other's joys and concerns. Here at Marion Methodist, we have become really, really good at praying with and for each other as evidenced by the number and depth of content on the prayer cards which are shared each week. The prayers that are shared each week show a great compassion for not only friends and family but for those in our schools, workplaces and neighborhoods. So aren't we already a praying church?

In Acts chapter 1 we read how the early church "all joined together constantly in prayer" and in chapter 2 "devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer". In the early stages of formation, prayer was at the core of all activities of the new church and its people as they prayed for the gospel of Christ to spread, and to strengthen them as a community of followers of Jesus. What was good for them is good for us yet today. We face many of the same challenges as our early church ancestors; strug-

gling to hang onto our beliefs in a secular culture of skepticism and doubt, attempting to share the gospel with a world which seems by turn hostile or indifferent to the message and striving to live our lives as mirrors of the grace and love we have received from Jesus Christ.

So as Christ's church in Marion, Iowa, we commit to being a praying church. We commit to pray for each other, for our community and for the power of Christ to be unleashed in our church and in our world. We endeavor to pray in personal solitude, as a member of a worshipping community, and as Christ's representative in our workplaces, our neighborhoods and our schools. We will strive to encourage and teach each other about prayer and we will testify as to how the awesome power and love of Christ has impacted our lives through prayer. May Paul's prayer be our prayer: "that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ—to the glory and praise of God." Philippians 1:9-11

That's internal memo this time around. Don't let it get by you.

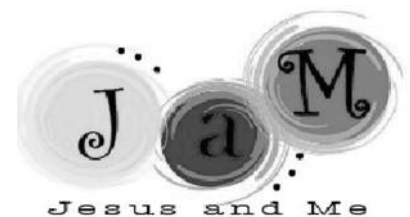

HOLY SEASON OF LENT

The Holy Season of Lent is highlighted by the events of Holy Week which begins with our Palm Sunday services and climaxes with our celebration of Jesus' resurrection from the dead on Easter morning. At First United Methodist Church one of our Holy Week traditions is our "Lenten Moments" early in the morning Monday through Good Friday.

You are invited to add the discipline of a 7 - 7:25 AM service to your commemoration of Holy Week. Each day a different member of our congregation will be presenting a spiritual truth and their personal testimony.

It has long been the joy of the Christian in North America to freely speak his or her faith, and it is certainly a joy to be present when "one of us" testifies to our God. I pray that you will come and join us in worship those moments, and if you're able, stay for a little while after and share the breakfast that some loving hands will prepare for us.

Prayer Vigil - What's that?

A prayer vigil is a time set aside in the life of the church to be in prayer. Prayer vigils have been part of Holy Week observance at FUMC for many years. The Good Friday prayer vigil is a 24 hour observance from noon on Good Friday (3/29) until noon on Saturday (3/30).

Why have a prayer vigil? During the Good Friday prayer vigil, we are observing the time that Jesus was in the Garden of Gethsemane with his disciples, before he was arrested.

"They went to a place called Gethsemane; and he said to his disciples, 'Sit here while I pray'. Keep awake and pray that you may not come into the time of trial; the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak."
(Mark 14:32,38)

What do you do at a prayer vigil? It is a time of prayer, meditation, reflection, and one-on-one time with God. You may bring your own Bible or devotional materials, but there are also devotional materials provided as well as suggested topics for prayer and reflection.

How long do I stay? As long as you like. You can sign up for 1/2 hour or hour increments, but you may stay as long as you like beyond your scheduled time.

Where is the vigil held? In the sanctuary, the chapel, or the prayer room.

How do I sign up? Look for sign up sheets in the narthex outside the sanctuary, in the hallway beside the chapel, outside the prayer room and in Fellowship Hall. You may also contact by email Vicki Standley at vstandley@marionmethodist.org or call the church office at 377-4856.

UMW at Work

One Day, I thought I had a great idea! I decided that we, UMW, should make fleece blankets for ProjectLinus. Now ProjectLinus provides fleece blankets, quilts, or afghans for critically ill children. Wouldn't that be FUN?!?!? But, I knew not what I was doing. The process of making each blanket took about one hour. Many volunteers worked many hours prior to the event to prepare some of the blankets. So, we proceeded to plan our mission activity and luncheon for March 2nd from 11:00-1:00. Every single table in fellowship hall was covered with fleece with many workers circled around the blankets - cutting and tying. In addition other women and girls were making cards for the children. We completed in excess of 25 blankets - we lost count after about 20 and more women are finishing the blankets at home.

Oh, and by the way, we also filled three suitcases full of women's products to send to the "Women of the Well" - a UMW group in Mitchellville State Prison for Women.

Needless to say, we are putting HOPE, FAITH, and LOVE into Action. And as always the food was GREAT!!!

Thank you to all of the women who donated fleece and women's products, cut and tied fleece, made food, decorated the tables, made cards, and packed three suitcases. YOU CAME THROUGH WITH FLYING COLORS AS ALWAYS. YOU ARE AWESOME!!!
