It's Simple – Right?

Jesus in Matthew 28:18b-20a says: "All authority in heaven and earth has been given me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you." Simple – right?

Paragraph 120 Book of Discipline of the United Methodist Church states: "The mission of the church is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Local churches provide the most significant arena through which disciple-making occurs." Simple – right?

Certainly with the mission set forth by Jesus in scripture and our Book of Discipline United Methodism is growing by leaps and bounds right? Mark Tooley, president of the Institute on Religion & Democracy and a practicing United Methodist, recently told *The Christian Post* "Methodism in the U.S. has lost membership every year since 1964. Thus, I am no longer confident in the survival of the UMC in America." But it's so simple – right?

What has gone wrong? Doug Anderson, director of the Reuben Job Center for effective ministry told our staff a few years back, that one reason the church has great difficulty staying focused on disciple making because it has become preference driven not purpose centered. Any church that claims the Great Commission

in Matthew 28 (above) as their own must first conquer this issue.

The "Preference Driven" church has dominated the North American Christian landscape since the 1960's. Preference Driven churches tend to make decisions based on a few peoples preferences including: How things have always been, what type of music must be utilized in worship or not, who is in charge of the children's music, what color the sanctuary should be, etc. Preference Driven Churches will have regular cycles of conflict every 7-10 years and the focus of the church is inward and disciple making growth is a near impossibility.

On the other hand, a "Purpose Centered" church bases their decisions on what they think God wants them to do. They focus their attention on prayer, collaboration with each other to find God's way and tend to enable people to do the work of the church in parallel with their spiritual gifts. The purpose centered church is saturated with creative discussion but rarely conflict. Purpose Centered churches always focus out and disciple making is a clear mark of their ministry.

Clearly if you have been part of First United Methodist Church, Marion for more than a week or so, you can see the leadership of the church weekly endeavors to keep our work centered on the purpose of winning souls for

Christ and nurturing them into the Kingdom. Clearly, you have heard admonishment after admonishment and encouragement after encouragement and challenge after challenge to keep our eyes constantly focused on the purpose of the church.

This is Simple – but it is not easy.

Being sinners, and we all are, from time to time we fall down and let our preferences crawl in front of our purpose. We would "prefer" to sing our favorite songs, hear about money less, have the building at our temperature, tell the pastor to preach harder or softer and replace the apple juice with grape juice like they had in bible times at church. These preferences easily can root the pursuit of our purpose right out of our minds. Thousands of churches have allowed this and thus, the United Methodist Church is not fulfilling its purpose.

This is unacceptable. The death of our church when growth is so simple will not happen on our watch.

The response is simple – but not easy. It begins with the claim that we will increase our disciple making goals, capabilities and prowess for the sake of God's Kingdom. We must claim this as our purpose – above any other. Then, we must understand what a disciple is and learn how one is made. Keep reading and keep listening; that instruction and guidance is coming directly.

Why Do We Keep Spending Money on These Buildings?

The Board of Trustees and every member of the staff has been asked by one of you, why do we keep spending money on these old buildings if we are moving to a new facility? Here are our answers and insight as to what is coming.

- These buildings have been consecrated and anointed for the worship of Almighty God and the service of men and women. Until they are completely replaced, we will care for them as such.
- The What's Next Task force has just begun their work so the future of our buildings is truly an "unknown" at this moment. So, if they are part of our future ministry plan we want to keep them up to date and if they become a property that needs to be sold it needs to "show well."
- We must keep our buildings in compliance with our fire and safety inspections.

This leads to three very visible projects the trustees are undertaking right now.

- The carpet in the main hallway from the handicapped doors to the intersection of the main building and education building will be replaced in the next month because it is bubbling up near the children's library and has become a tripping hazard.
- The "newer" brick and concrete stairway entrance on 12th St. has experienced some tuck-point failure which will be addressed directly to make sure further damage is not experienced.
- Sometime in 2013 we hope to replace the badly stained carpet on the office level of the Carnegie Building.
