The Externally Focused Church: Servants in Relationship

The Social Network is a film about how Facebook came into being and, whether you are on Facebook or not, Facebook is indisputably a big deal. Interestingly enough the film does not depict a room full of engineers writing algorithms or wrestling with some sort of binary language like you might expect in this story about such a significant invention in the digital world.

Facebook is all about transforming people’s lives by bringing them closer together as they build relationships through their account. Sadly, for those of you who have seen the Social Network, the great irony is that as the inventors pursue with abandon the growth of this social media, their relationships with each other absolutely crumble. The film ends with an account of how much money each person won or lost in the ensuing lawsuits and an account of the end of the relationships between former best friends.

The painful thing for me in the story of Facebook is the creators forgot to be in relationship with each other as they were seeking (and succeeding) to change the world. I tell you this to remind you of this simple truth: Relationships are important.

The Biblical story is ripe with relationships. In fact, the Holy Scriptures themselves have been explained by many as the story of God’s relationship with humanity. In Jeremiah 24:7

the Lord says: “I will give them a heart to know me, that I am the LORD. They will be my people, and I will be their God...” This sentiment is repeated over and over in the Old and New Testament because we matter to God and He desires to be in relationship with us.

We come to know our Lord in the context of a relationship. Our Lord, the One God is not a concept, not an idea, certainly not a website, He is the living God and to know him we must be in relationship with him, personally and intimately. Jesus instructs us to “Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind” and “love your neighbor as yourself” (Mt. 22:37, 39) which is to say, give yourself completely to your relationship with the Lord and if you give yourself completely to that relationship you will desire give of yourself to others.

Relationships focused on those outside of the church is very important to the building of the Kingdom. Churches can easily fall into the trap of creating programs and outreach that are designed to help but in reality place us on an island of irrelevance. Eric Swanson a pastor in the Western United States leads a church that was known throughout the community as a church that effectively serves many, many people. When asked at a church strategy conference what they did he

simply said: “We simply decided that nothing in the world happens outside of relationships...and the best way to create relationships is to enter the world of those you seek to know, rather than waiting for them to enter yours.”

Simply put, if you want to engage people in the Church of Jesus Christ quit waiting for them to come and go start talking and listening to them. Jesus ate with sinners, sat with tax collectors, talked with prostitutes, all people who in the terms of our day “would not likely darken the door of the church.” Yet, each came into a relationship with the Lord because he went to where they were. There he could know them, listen to them, serve them, love them and become loved by them.

His example for the church is to be externally focused. His people (the Christians) are to be in the world making friends, getting to know people, listening to them, serving them in hopes of introducing them to the One we love. Make no mistake, the goal of an externally focused church is to serve, but the ultimate goal is to build the kingdom. This is service with a higher calling and a stronger motivation. Relationships are not only essential for gaining trust within the community; they are the door by which many individuals come into a relationship with Christ.



Where are we at on the Building Plans?

The question has been asked: “Where are we at on the Building Plans?” The answer is pretty simple.

1. Since our congregational meeting in April we have been working on the first step required of us (see bold print in “steps required” box below). This has included much work in Civil Engineering the sight (maybe you saw the machines taking soil samples from our land), architectural drawing and consultations. Shortly (9/13) the building committee will see a more detailed and we hope to have that circulated as soon as possible.
2. The “What’s Next Task Force” will begin their meetings shortly. They have been assigned: to examine the opportunities for the future purposes of our current church facilities This Task Force will exhaustively audit and study our current facilities (Main church/Wesley Hall/Annex, Mission Education Building and Carnegie Center) regarding how they might benefit the Kingdom and our community in the years to come. Their report will be many months in the making.
3. Many folks and groups during July and August went to “Pray at the Property” for the many ways that property and this church through it will serve the land.
4. Lastly, mark your calendars for a huge celebration. On November 18, 2012 at 6 PM we are going to celebrate, eat and light some fireworks off at the property. More details will come later.

Steps required by the United Methodist Book of Discipline before we build. (Logistics suggest that there are likely months between each step.)

- **Building Committee works on Phase 1 detailed plans**
- Building Committee requests and has meeting with *District Committee on Location and Church Building*. They will approve or disapprove our theological foundations, proposed timeline and plans for building, cost estimate, fundraising and financing.

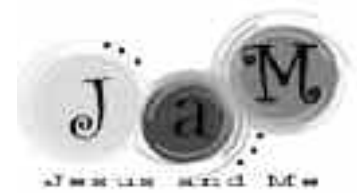
