# Marion First United Methodist Church

*The mission of the Church is to make Disciples of  
Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.*



## God's plan for us = Love God. *Love others. Change the world.*

In the last *Marion Methodist*, Pastor Mike declared that “our time has come”. He was referring to the importance of living out our recently adopted mission statement. The statement proclaims, “The mission of the Church is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.”

There are of course many ways to approach the mandate to make disciples. However there are two critical components that must be part of any disciple making and world transforming. According to Jesus, all of the law and the prophets point to two things: Love God with all that you are; Love others.

Now, isn't that nice? I think when we hear things like “Love God, Love others” it can sound oversimplified and perhaps easy, but when we really consider what Jesus meant when asked the question,

36 “Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?”

37 Jesus replied: “Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.”

38 This is the first and greatest commandment.

39 And the second is like it: “Love your neighbor as yourself.”

40 All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments.” Matthew 22:36-40

Jesus didn't run from the question. He answered it clearly and simply. However, just because the answer is simple does not mean it is easy.

The mission of the church, “to make disciples for the transforma-

tion of the world”, is like that. It's simple to state but hard to live out.

Making disciples starts with loving God more than anything else in one's life. That truth is the core of how we must define discipleship. Not by actions only, but first and foremost by an ultimate love for God which manifests itself in our complete devotion to God and then leading to our love for others “as ourselves.”

A disciple must love God with all his/her heart, all his/her mind, and with all his/her strength.

Therefore our mission as a church must glorify and magnify God, so that people can see the greatness of God and fall in love with him. We are called to challenge each other to love God more, to understand what that means, to make more of Jesus so that people can see his greatness.

That's our call. That's our mission. We are not called simply to help people be nice and do good things.

The mission of the church is to call people to fall in love with God. As a result, their lives will be transformed. Jesus said in John 14:15 “If you love me, keep my commands.”

A life of discipleship begins with a love of God and leads to life change, which leads then to a love for others, which then leads to a transformed world. So let me ask you a practical question. How has your love of God changed your life? What's different about you because you love God with all your heart, mind and strength?

If we claim to be disciples of Jesus but we knowingly and willingly ignore or disobey his

commands, then we are fooling ourselves. Loving God more than anything requires obedience to Christ and his commands. Our mission as a church is to make disciples of Jesus.

This may sound pretty basic and obvious that as a church we are called to make disciples, but we have to truly understand what that means in order to avoid merely being religious.

The trap of religion is to emphasize the transforming of a person's life without first loving God with all your heart, soul and strength. Rules and morality are often put forth as the gateway to salvation rather than the person of Jesus Christ. Our focus and mission as a church is to proclaim the gospel to the world that salvation is not found by rule keeping and behavior change, but rather through the grace of God and the sacrifice of Christ on the cross. Repentance and faith grounded in love for God (which first came from God toward us) is the path of discipleship.

This is our mission and because of our love for God and neighbor we will strive to live lives that honor God and bring peace and justice to this world. We will proclaim that God is love! We will show the world God's transforming power and the joy that comes from being a disciple. This will change the world. God has promised us. It is already happening around us. May we continue to live lives of love of God and neighbor in all we do.

We will then look at this city's relationship with today's world.

When you purchase FAIR TRADE, you are literally SAVING LIVES in the many countries who produce these products such as coffee, tea, jewelry, clothing, etc. When people receive fair wages, they are able to feed their families and send their children to school (even the girls). Attending school is the best way for children in foreign countries to avoid being victims of Human Trafficking.

Please take even just a small step and visit our Fair Trade "shop". And then consider purchasing an item or 2 or 3 items that are FAIR TRADE on a regular basis. Look for the FAIR TRADE symbol when you are purchasing especially chocolate, coffee and tea.
